APA has a deep bench of expertise. Even though Wednesday's action was difficult for all in the organization, we are confident our plans going forward will boost efficiencies, help us better support our members and district branches, and invest in the Association's strategic initiatives.

MPA Asking Members to Consider Implications of the APA Staff Reductions

After a group discussion among DB Executives yesterday, I am particularly concerned about the termination of APA staff members Craig Obey, Erin Philp and Tim Clement. These are the top three key staff in the Department of Government Relations who assist the states. The consensus from the call was that the APA cannot fulfill its advocacy mission or support and collaborate with the District Branches on their advocacy work without these staff members. Additionally, APA physician leadership from the Council on Government Relations (CAGR) has met and concluded the same. The APA Board of Trustees meets on December 9th and 10th, and this will be on their agenda. MPA is requesting your support on the following action item:


Doctors Mimi Pham and Dominic Adams organized the entire adventure for their fellow residents.

DMH 52 Weeks of Progress Each week this year, DMH will be highlighting a specific service or program to increase awareness of services and support available across Mississippi. Our hope is by the end of 2023, you will know more about offerings in your state through seeing these

highlights - 52 Weeks of Progress. This week we highlight substance use disorder services for pregnant and parenting women.

DMH certified pregnant and parenting women providers are on a mission to uplift pregnant women, parenting men and women, and IV drug users. Providers served 101 pregnant women and 93 parenting women in the specialized substance use disorder treatment programs in FY23. Treatment centers provide referrals for prenatal care and provide interim counseling and education services within 48 hours of receiving the referral. Certified providers are ready to meet the needs of pregnant women and parenting mothers or fathers with dependent children under age five, priority admission is offered to pregnant women and IV drug users. Mississippi is focused on preventing opioid use disorder among pregnant women and women who could become pregnant and to make sure women with opioid use disorder get proper treatment.

THREE THINGS TO KNOW ABOUT: SUPERVISING NURSE PRACTITIONERS Written by

- 1. Before hiring or agreeing to supervise a nurse practitioner, familiarize yourself with your state's regulations regarding a nurse practitioner's scope of practice and requirements for supervision. This information may typically be found on your state's board of nursing website.
- 2. If a formal collaboration agreement is required, obtain a sample form from the board of nursing if available. The form will set forth what is specifically required of you; for example, how often must the charts of the nurse practitioner be reviewed and what protocols need to be in place
- 3. Before extending an offer of employment, verify the credentials of the nurse practitioner. This should include verification of: education, licensing status and board complaints, certification, CE hours, employment history, malpractice history, a credit check, and a criminal background check.

Patients are frequently misdiagnosed as Major Depression Disorder, which leads to utilization of inappropriate treatments including antidepressant monotherapy. This course will review risk factors of emergence of mixed symptoms with the use of antidepressants, the challenges and opportunities of the use of antidepressants, as well as Ketamine, and the efficacy and tolerability of antipsychotics, lithium, and mood stabilizers in the treatment of Bipolar Depression.

3) ASSOCIATE PROGRAM DIRECTOR POSITION AT MISSISSIPPI STATE HOSPITAL

Mississippi State Hospital (MSH) is seeking to fill its vacant Associate Program Director position within its Psychiatry Residency Program. MSH is a licensed 382-bed state psychiatric hospital which is accredited by The Joint Commission and located in Rankin County, Mississippi. The hospital's dedicated patient care staff consists of highly skilled and caring medical professionals, nurses, behavioral health staff, social workers, and support staff who work together to provide patient-centered care on a daily basis. Services provided include: adult and child/adolescent psychiatric treatment, substance use disorder treatment, as well as treatment provided for forensic patients.

Further, MSH promotes educational growth within the psychiatric field through its ACGME accredited psychiatry residency program as well as through other educational ventures and partnerships it has with entities such as nursing schools and psychology departments throughout the country.

The Associate Residency Program Director is an integral role and includes the following responsibilities:

- Maintain and develop resident training curricula in accordance with the ACGME's Common Program Requirements (CPR) and Professional Standards and Requirements (PSR).
- Formulate goals and objectives for each clinical rotation as outlined by the CPR.
- Participate in site visits and surveys.
- Ensure the quality of didactic and clinical education at sites participating in the program by monitoring the clinical learning and working environment (CLER) at all participating sites.
- Assure compliance of participating sites with ACGME requirements.
- Serve as the course director as assigned by the Residency Program Director (PD) and provide didactic lectures.
- Serve on the Clinical Competence Committee (CCC), Program Evaluation Committee (PEC), the Recruitment and Selection Committee, and the Graduate Medical Education Executive Committee (GMEC).
- Coordinate outpatient experiences for PGY-3 and PGY-4 residents with various local mental health centers.

Minimum Qualifications: Verifiable Doctor of Medicine Degree or Doctor of Osteopathic Medicine Degree from an accredited medical school; completion of a psychiatry residency program; a verifiable current, unrestricted license to practice medicine in the State of Mississippi; and board certification in psychiatry. The applicant must submit at least three references from peers.

Benefits: No after-hours call and no weekend call.

A physician working as an employee (not on contract) will receive benefits of health insurance, paid leave (personal, medical, and holiday), and participation in PERS (retirement system).

Prior to an offer of employment, the applicant must provide a copy of a current Mississippi Medical License, have satisfactory results from a criminal background check and have satisfactory results from a urine drug screen.
