This Week at the Mississippi

Legislature The sixth week of the 2024 Mississippi legislative session saw the

prior authorization again take center stage. On Thursday, Rep Sam Creekmore, Chair of the House Public Health Committee, presented a committee substitute on the Prior Authorization Reform Act, SB 2140 to the House for a vote. The bill was approved 115-2 present and 5 absent. and was transmitted back to the Senate. MPA has been working with the Dept of Insurance, MSMA and other specialties on fine tuning the details. The bill requires all health care providers and insurance companies in the state, including Medicaid and the state health plan to comply. It defines emergent and non-emergent situations as well as denials and appeals. The MS Dept of

Insurance would regulate and promulgate the rules on operation which include fines for each violation, same specialty peer review, appeals processes and categorizing diagnoses as urgent (48 hours on PA) and non-emergent (up to 7 days). An online portal for every company and a

Approximately 14% of adults and 12% of children exhibit clinically significant levels of "food addiction" based on the *DSM-5* criteria for substance use disorders. However, "food addiction" is not currently included as a recognized or provisional diagnostic category in the *DSM-5*. This course will consider the validity of "food addiction," review evidence of excessive food intake and what it can lead to, discuss the clinical relevance, and more.

The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) approved a 3.4% reduction in Medicare's physician payments for 2024. This cut is devastating to physician practices and the patients they care for, and could necessitate reduced staffing and office closures, disproportionately harming

rural and underserved communities. Please urge Congress to prevent these devastating cuts from going into effect by cosponsoring the Preserving Seniors' Access to Physicians Act of 2023 (H.R.6683).
