This Week at the Mississippi Legislature The picture to the left is the historic vote on HB



1725 that occurred on the House floor this ninth week of the 2024 Mississippi legislative session bringing Medicaid expansion up for consideration. Rep Missy McGee, Chairman of the House Medicaid Cte. handled the bill with no amendments and no questions. It was a clear sign that partisan politics can happen when an issue regarding people outweighs rhetoric. The deadline for bills to emerge from committee is Tuesday, March 5th. An additional Medicaid bill - to

provide presumptive eligibility to pregnant women, <u>HB 539</u> – cleared the Senate Medicaid Committee as well as the Mississippi State Senate on Thursday by a vote of 48-4. The bill will now head to the Governor for signature. This is a continuation of efforts that extended providing coverage postpartum up to 12 months achieved in regular session 2023.

Another win for medicine this week is the Mississippi Prior Authorization Reform Act, <u>SB</u> <u>2140</u>, passed without Governor Reeves' signature. It will go into effect July 1, 2024. MPA profusely thanks Senator Walter Michel, Chairman of the Senate Insurance Committee and author of SB 2140, as well as Rep. Sam Creekmore, Chair of the House Public and Human

Services Committee, for their leadership in shepherding this legislation through the process. Special recognition goes to Insurance Commissioner Mike Chaney, Lt. Governor Delbert Hosemann, and Speaker of the House Jason White for their commitment to bringing timely healthcare to Mississippi patients. It took 2 years but we finally got this important issue addressed by the Legislature.

- Make Kratom Schedule III
- Strengthen the Step Therapy/Fail First Protocol Override Statute
- Support a Change to CON regarding Psychiatric Residential Treatment Beds and Substance Use Disorder Beds in the State
- Add a Designated Child Psychiatrist to the Rural Physician Scholarship Program
- Broaden Testing Mechanisms for Street Drugs and Redefine Paraphernalia in MS to not Include Testing Strips for the Latest Abused Substances
- Maintaining a Physician Led Team Approach to Health Care

Approximately 14% of adults and 12% of children exhibit clinically significant levels of "food addiction" based on the *DSM-5* criteria for substance use disorders. However, "food addiction" is not currently included as a recognized or provisional diagnostic category in the *DSM-5*. This course will consider the validity of "food addiction," review evidence of excessive food intake and what it can lead to, discuss the clinical relevance, and more.

The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) approved a 3.4% reduction in Medicare's physician payments for 2024. This cut is devastating to physician practices and the patients they care for, and could necessitate reduced staffing and office closures, disproportionately harming rural and underserved communities. **Please urge Congress to prevent these devastating**

cuts from going into effect by cosponsoring the Preserving Seniors' Access to Physicians Act of 2023 (H.R.6683).
