# THREE THINGS TO KNOW ABOUT: SPLIT TREATMENT

1. Whereas once it was the psychiatrist who alone provided both therapy and medication management, today split treatment arrangements, where a psychiatrist provides pharmacotherapy and a non-medical therapist provides psychotherapy, have become much more common. In such arrangements, psychiatrists frequently find that they have substantially less control over their patients' overall treatment than they did in more traditional arrangements.

- 2. If the patient is high-risk, it is particularly important to ensure that the therapist is up to the task of dealing with a complex patient. It is not inappropriate to inquire as to his/her experience level and prior training as well as licensure and malpractice coverage.
- 3. There should be an agreement between the psychiatrist and the therapist as to how they will communicate, how often they will communicate, and what information will be shared. They should also determine whether there will be certain events/situations that will trigger contact for example, missed appointments, medication changes, or reports of suicidal ideation.
